The Gage Next Level Campaign

The campaign supports moving our main campus into a new highly accessible South Lake Union (SLU) space positioned at street-level. Additionally, it **strengthens** our artistic and administrative team, our infrastructure, and our tuition assistance program. Your participation in this Next Level Campaign enables us to bring high-quality art programming and experiences to an even broader, more inclusive community.

Join us in shaping our future. The strategic move to SLU is the result of a two-year analysis developed by the board of directors, staff leadership and key Gage advisors to ensure the organization's future stability, growth and expand its reach.

In the process, these core needs for Gage next level emerged:

- To have more efficient, highfunctioning spaces designed to best serve our visual arts instructors and students
- To be an integral part of the cultural fabric of Seattle in a more centralized location
- To have a more visible, public-facing location to showcase our artists' work
- To be closer to more public transportation options
- To be ADA accessible and up to date in all safety standards
- To have long-term lease stability

Revitalizing Gage and Downtown Seattle with Strategic Partnerships

Our search for a new home was perfectly timed with current commercial market trends to garner a win-win partnership with Amazon as the owner of the leased space. Amazon worked closely with Gage to provide terms which made it possible for the school to take advantage of the high-quality space at 2105/2107 Westlake Avenue (intersection 8th and Westlake, one block from Amazon Spheres.)

The benefits of this partnership include:

- Street-level retail space will be activated as a creative hub—a powerhouse district where arts thrive in coexistence with other sectors – tech, healthcare, higher education, and social services.
- Gage becomes part of a nationwide trend of revitalizing downtown districts through the integration of arts and experiences.
- Gage will have more opportunities to co-create programming with SLU cultural district neighbors including Cornish College of the Arts, MOHAI, SIFF's Cinerama and the Center for Wooden Boats.
- Gage reaps deep benefits of this new location and a purpose-built space (see "A Facility Built for Creativity and Connection").



Through the Gage Next Level Campaign, our partnership with you will strengthen the Seattle community, enable us to bring our high-quality arts education programming to a broader more inclusive population, and help us realize our long-term strategic plan for a thriving art school that is deeply connected in community.

Campaign **Pillars**

Our campaign seeks to raise \$2.5 million from individuals, grant makers, corporations, and civic partners. The funds will support the costs of the physical relocation, key space enhancements, and targeted infrastructure and operation investments to better support our community and make Gage more accessible.



A Facility Built for Connection and Creativity

An award-winning, nonprofit-focused team at the esteemed architectural firm NBBJ is designing this space. It embodies openness and accessibility through its centralized location and welcoming layout. Exciting new features and amenities include:

- 14,000 square feet of studios, classrooms and spaces to house an event/lecture hall, a library, offices, and meetings
- A prominent corner building with street-visible art galleries and studio space
- Easy access to a wide range of public transportation options, onsite free or low-cost parking, charging stations, and secure bicycle parking

- A design optimized for different approaches to learning, including spaces for formal instruction, self-discovery, group dialogue and critique
- A dedicated media room with technology to record online classes and photograph student artwork
- New construction that is fully ADAcompliant, with modern air filtration, fire and safety features, and comfortable temperature control
- Ample natural light and adjustable lighting systems to meet artists' needs.

- Successfully share our mission and tell our story with a new, refreshed Gage brand
- Improve our ability to manage student registration and customer service, and connect with our supportive donors by adopting secure, modern data management systems.

Guaranteed Tuition Assistance

At Gage, we believe arts programming should be available to everyone in the community, regardless of age, experience, skill level, and economic means. The Gage Next Level Campaign will expand the allocation of tuition assistance committed in the annual budget so that no one is ever turned away due to their economic situation. This will be in addition to the named scholarships and many free and low-cost programs that Gage already offers.





Adult Programs

ATELIERS are our seven immersive, multiyear study programs (full- and part-time) for artists who want to deepen their craft through mentorship by esteemed artists and as part of a community of dedicated artistic peers. In person and online.

CLASSES & WORKSHOPS for a range of ability levels in drawing, painting, sculpture, and printmaking with a shared focus on strengthening foundational skills and nurturing creative expression.

PUBLIC LECTURES on campus and at Town Hall deepen understanding of art history and contemporary art topics. Free or low-cost.

OPEN STUDIO sessions welcome all artists to experience drawing a live model

PARTNERSHIPS with workplaces such as Amazon and Wizards of the Coast enhance their employees' proficiency in creative problem-solving directly applicable to their job duties. Gage also partners with Antioch University so students from multiple campuses and degree programs can take Gage art classes to satisfy the fine arts credits.

Youth Programs

CLASSES & WORKSHOPS in a range of media and techniques are offered to youth ages 6-12, and teens ages 13-18. In person and online.

SUMMER CAMPS combine artmaking with movement activities such as parkour, capoeira, yoga and dance for ages 7-11. Teen summer programs provide in-depth and focused art study for serious, emerging artists.

TEEN ART STUDIO (TAS) is a free drop-in program for ages 13-18 every Friday evening in three locations: Capitol Hill, South Park, and Bellevue. TAS provides high-caliber artmaking experiences within a supportive and inclusive community of peers.

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
